

WHAT PERMIT DO I NEED?

Catering Permit

Only Idaho wineries with a validly issued retail beer and wine license can obtain this permit from the city or county where the event will be held. Please contact the county or city clerks office where the event will be held for further information and permitting.

A catering permit must be obtained when:

1. Going to another licensed Idaho winery location/premises. Per Idaho Code 23-1337



Winery Sponsored Event Permit

A winery sponsored event permit is issued to a valid Idaho winery licensee when they wish to leave their licensed premises. A winery cannot be the sponsor listed on these permits. These permits are issued from ABC. Permit requests must be submitted at least seven days prior to the event date via email to: abc@isp.idaho.gov
Per Idaho Code 23-1338

Examples of when a winery sponsored event permit is needed:

1. Local Farmer's Markets
2. Unlicensed Venues
3. Licensed retailers. Keep in mind that this will count towards your 8 per year for that location.
4. Wine events where multiple wineries will attend at an unlicensed location. (Ex. Savor Idaho)

Nonprofit Event Permit

These permits are issued from the ABC office. Wineries are not able to obtain a nonprofit permit. Idaho Code 23-1336

If a nonprofit permit is obtained by another party, wineries can do the following:

1. Donate their product to the nonprofit entity who obtained the permit
2. Attend the event to market and educate the public on their product.
3. A licensed beer and wine retailer may receive or store wine to be used at the event.

Wineries CANNOT pour their product at these events. Only the permit holder, their volunteers or a licensed retailer may pour
