About the Scholarship

Under Idaho Code, the Idaho Grape Growers and Wine Producers Commission is charged with encouraging the planting and development of native vineyards and the production of wines from grapes, fruits and berries grown in Idaho. The Idaho Wine Education Scholarship will further that goal by assisting with the education of individuals interested in Idaho viticulture and enology. It is the Commission's hope that in turn, selected applicants will use the knowledge obtained to participate in the growth of the Idaho wine industry.

Any Idaho resident with a desire to obtain education to further a passion for viticulture and enology in Idaho is welcome to apply. Each year, one individual will be selected as the recipient of the Idaho Wine Education Scholarship. The selection committee will consist of members of the Idaho wine industry who will be the recipient's future colleagues and peers.

The Idaho Wine Education Scholarship may be used to further the recipient's education in viticulture and enology by means of an educational seminar, trade school, or 4-year accredited college. The use of the scholarship funds must be in relations to viticulture or enology in some aspect.

Selection Process

Applicants will be selected on the basis of outstanding community service, achievement in academic and volunteer roles, demonstrated leadership, and interest in a career in Idaho viticulture. Finalists will be notified by January 10th and interviews will start January 15th if the selection committee determines interviews are necessary. The winners will be chosen after interviews with the committee.

Recognition & Celebration

The Scholarship recipient will be honored at the Idaho Wine Commission's Annual Meeting, February 26th-27th, 2019.

Idaho residents with a passion for pursuing a career in viticulture and enology who intend to work in the Idaho's viticulture industry.
